Rescue

Most of the trauma experienced by wildlife is a result of their interaction with humans; such as gunshot wounds, dogs, cats, pesticides, power lines, fences, and habitat destruction. SWRR seeks to offset these hazards through its ongoing rehabilitation and educational programs; and by encouraging mankind to learn to appreciate, respect and protect wildlife.

Rehabilitation



Our highly trained volunteers care for the many birds and mammals that come into the rescue center. Most of the birds are cared for at the center, while all of the mammals are sheltered with volunteers trained for

the 24-hour care these injured and orphaned animals demand before they are ready to be released.



Release

Once the bird or mammal is ready to survive on its own, it is returned to the wild. More than 60% of the animals are able to be released. This is by far the most rewarding part of our work here at SWRR.
